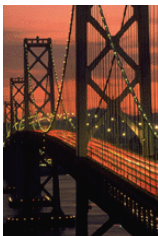


LIBRARY INSTRUCTION

LIBRARY INSTRUCTION HAS 3 TIERS

Tier 1 is taught in LAS I 101 Introduction to the University, ENGL 101 College English I, and other 101 classes.

On the tour, students will see:

- ◆ Student-centered areas of Ablah Library, such as Circulation, Reference, Reserves, the Reading Room, Government Documents, and Special Collections, and will be able to identify the services provided
- ◆ How to get more help when they need it.
- ◆ A brief introduction to the library website in the computer lab.

Tier 2 is taught in ENGL 102 College English II and ENGL 210 Composition: Business, Professional, and Technical Writing.

By the end of this orientation, students will be able to:

- ◆ Carry out a simple search for library materials, a skill transferable to the Online Catalog, many library databases, and basic search engines
- ◆ Identify a call number and use it to find a book or periodical on the shelf
- ◆ Identify scholarly journals
- ◆ Locate the full-text of an article.

Tier 3 identifies all other levels of library instruction. This library instruction is highly customized for each course.

In addition to topics specified by the instructor, students learn how to:

- ◆ Select an appropriate resource for an information need
- ◆ Use subject-specific information sources.
