Cambridge Scientific Abstracts (CSA)

MEDLINE is the bibliographic database of the National Library of Medicine. It contains citations, abstracts, and some links to full-text articles from more than 3,700 journals. MEDLINE includes articles in the fields of biological sciences, physical sciences, social sciences and education, technology, agriculture, food, industry, humanities, information science and communications, and health care. MEDLINE is available through multiple interfaces (CSA, Thompson, PubMed). In CSA, MEDLINE's coverage is from 1994 to present.

MathSciNet
Produced by the American Mathematical Society (AMS). Provides reviews and abstracts of the mathematical research literature of the world as well as advance announcements of new articles, books, and proceedings to be reviewed. Provides comprehensive coverage of international research in mathematics and mathematically related research other disciplines. Contains abstracts from approximately 2,000 journals, conference proceedings and proceedings papers, books or chapters, advanced-level textbooks, and published dissertations. Coverage: 1940-present.

MEDLINE (CSA)
Provides citations and abstracts for over 4,800 journals published worldwide in the life sciences with an emphasis on medicine and health. Produced by the National Library of Medicine. Not searchable using MeSH (Medical Subject Headings.) Coverage: 2000-present.

Select "M" on the top menu, and then click on "Medline (CSA)" to open database.

Search Clear

Terms can be searched in various ways. **(Keywords, Descriptors, Author, etc)**. Select from the dropdown lists.

Searching for terms **Anywhere** is the default

Use an **asterisk (*)** to truncate terms to find alternate endings. For example, **smok*** will return records with the words **smoke, smoking, smokers, etc.**

Using the Search Results

Number of results and the terms you searched.

Click here to go to the bottom of the screen and refine the search.

More Information on Accessing Full Text



Some article citations will have a link to full-text immediately available to you. Click on the Full-Text or Link to Full-text hyperlinks in order to retrieve these items.



When you do not see the links to full-text, click on the WSU 360 full-text link. Clicking this link creates a search for full-text across all WSU databases.

If, after clicking on the 360 Link, you receive a message stating "Sorry, online full-text is not available," then you should look further down on the same page for the option to search the WSU Catalog to find the item in print (search either by Title of Journal or ISSN; you will get the same results). This searches the WSU catalog to see if we subscribe to the journal either electronically or in print. If you still get no results, this means WSU does not have access to the item either electronically or in print. At this point, return to the 360 Link results screen. Choose to Request this item from another library by clicking on the "Submit Request" link.

Managing Search Results

In all the CSA databases such as MEDLINE (CSA) the process of managing search results will look similar. First, you will need to mark the items you would like to save. Once you have marked your items, click on the Marked Items hyperlink in the top-right corner to view your options for saving and exporting your citations.
