ProQuest Nursing

This database is designed to meet the needs of researchers at health-care facilities as well as students enrolled in nursing programs at academic institutions. This database offers complete text and images from such journals as *Nursing*, *Nursing Management*, *Nursing Economics*, *Nursing Forum*, *RN*, *Journal of Nursing Education*, *Nurse Practitioner*, *Nurse Researcher* and *Nursing Diagnosis*. All of the source publications are available in the ASCII full-text format. Nearly all of them also offer articles in the full-image and Text+Graphics formats. For several publications coverage from 1992 is available. For some, full-image articles go back to 1988; Text+Graphics, to 1996. Directions for using this database appear below. 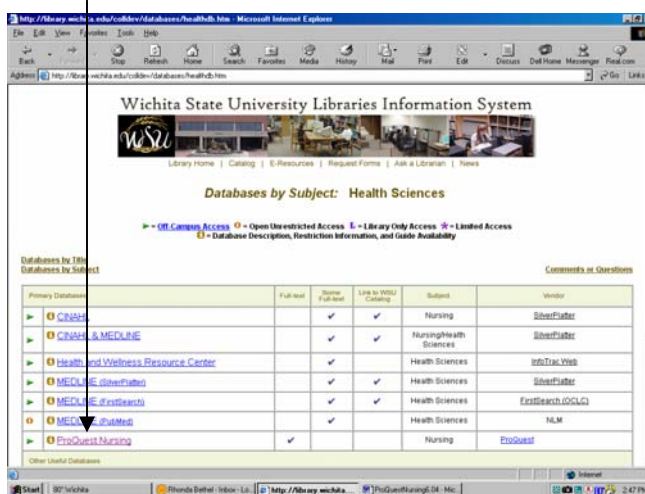

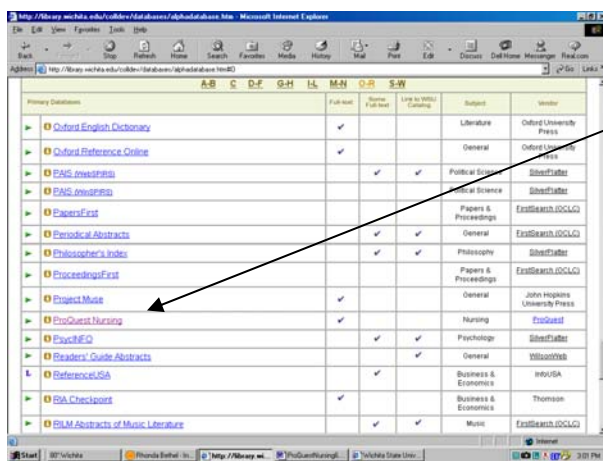

Select **Health Sciences** from the list of the available databases arranged **By Subject**.

When the list of health sciences databases appears, select **ProQuest Nursing**.



You can accomplish the same results by using the **Title** listing of databases and selecting **ProQuest Nursing**.



Once you click ProQuest Nursing, you will be taken to a screen where you have the option to either **Begin Searching** or to **Browse Study Paths**. **Study Paths** are available for both Practical Nursing and Registered Nursing; these paths enable you to browse documents that have been recommended by nurse educators on specific topics. You can browse study paths by clicking the topic that interests you. Instead of browsing Study Paths, you may also choose to **Begin Searching**. Clicking this option takes you straight into the database where you will enter terms relevant to your topic in the search box.

Begin Searching

Basic Search

The default search screen is the Basic Search. On the **Basic Search** screen, enter the terms you want the computer to match. Combine terms using the AND, OR, and NOT connectors as needed.

Type in your Keywords

Type your search terms (keywords) into the box. You may use single words (sleep), phrases (sleep deprivation), or combine keywords using boolean operators (sleep deprivation AND children).

- **Boolean Operators** (and, or, not): Use to link or combine keywords. **And** finds records that have both your first and second keywords (stress and anger) and will narrow your search results. **Or** finds records that contain either your first keyword or your second keyword, or both (stress or anger), and will broaden your search. **Not** excludes the second keyword from your search (stress not anger).
- **Truncation**: Use the asterisk (*) as the truncation symbol to search for all words starting with the same root. For example, behav* will find behave, behavior(s), behavioral, and behaviour(s).

Limit (or Narrow) your Search Results (Optional)

You may limit your search results by selecting: **Date range**; **Full text articles only**; or **Scholarly journals**.

Start the Search

Click on the **Search** button to perform your search.

Advanced Search

Advanced Search allows you to search for words in a combination of different parts of the database. For example you could look for both an author's name and an article title at the same time.

Interpreting/Using your search results.

The number of items or records that match your search request will be indicated on the upper left-hand side of the screen. To review your search results, simply scroll through the items listed on the lower part of the screen. Each record contains a description of one publication – typically a journal article. You may sort your search results by **Most recent articles first** or by **Most relevant articles first** by selecting from the drop down menu located at the top right-hand corner of the

results listing. Mark records by clicking in the box near each record's number. Display the marked records by clicking the **marked items** hyperlink.

Additional Searching Techniques to Consider

- After you have run a search and find an article that seems relevant, you may wish to view the item details and select **Subjects** with which to run a new search. Subjects are terms that have been assigned to articles in the database to take the guesswork out of searching by using a single term to describe a concept. If the Subjects seem relevant, you can click the check boxes next to the Subjects and run a new search.
- **Refine Search:** The Refine Search hyperlink appears to the right of the number of search results. You can click this at any time in order to immediately modify your search.
- **Publication Search** shows you the listing of all journals that are indexed by ProQuest Nursing. You can select a specific publication by title to search.
- **Recent Searches** allows you to review your searches for the current session and combine them or redisplay them.
