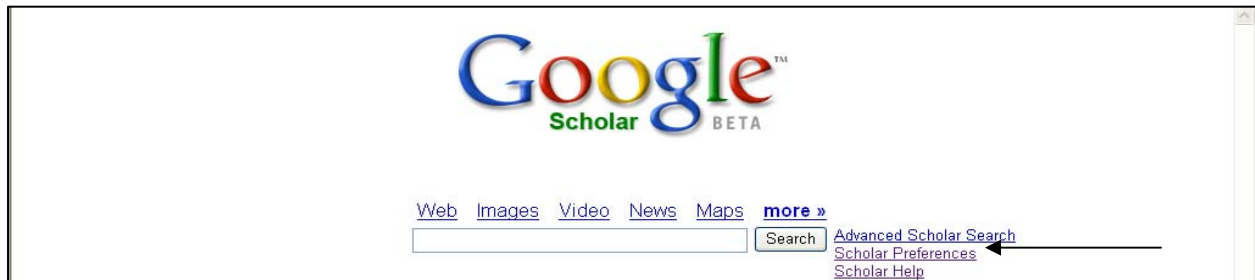
Using Google Scholar with EndNote

You can import citations from *Google Scholar* directly into *EndNote*. To do so, you must first set this option as a preference in *Google Scholar*.

Setting preferences in Google Scholar

- Click on the **Scholar Preferences** link to the right of the *Google Scholar* search box



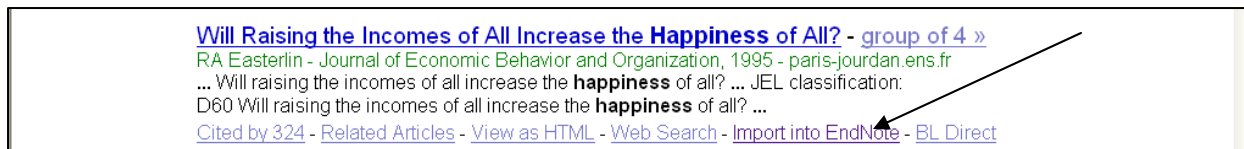
- Scroll to the bottom of the list of preference options to find the **Bibliography Manager**



- Click in the radio button for **Show links to import citations into**
- Click on the drop-down arrow, and select **EndNote**
- Click on the **Save Preferences** button

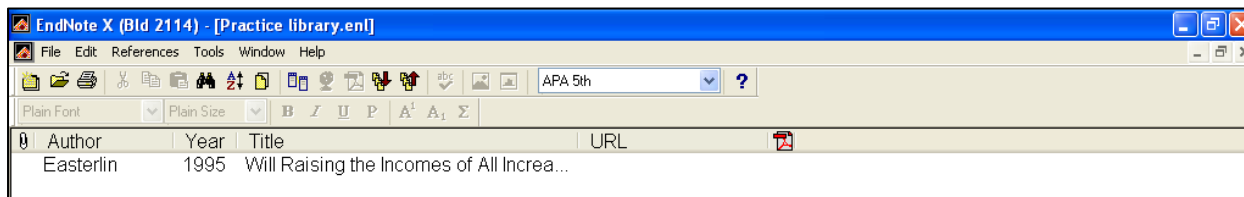
Locating the link to EndNote on your results screen

Once you have enabled *EndNote*, your *Google Scholar* search results will include a link to **Import into EndNote**.

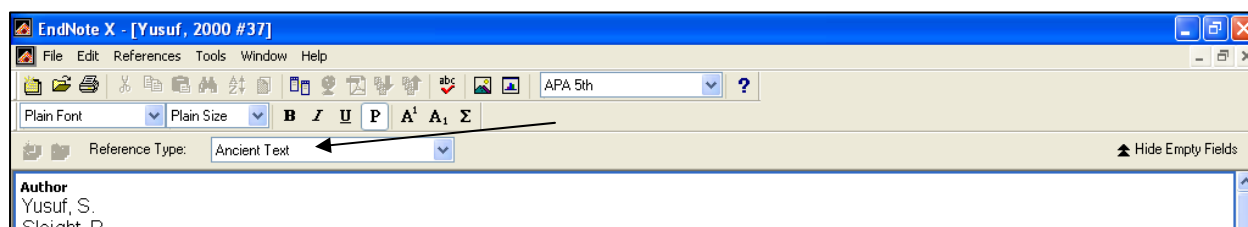


Importing citations

- Click on the **Import into EndNote** link, and *EndNote* will automatically open (If a window appears asking if you want to *Open* or *Save* the file, choose **Open**)
- Choose the *EndNote* library into which you want to import the citation
- Watch it appear!



- Double click on the citation to make sure the complete bibliographic information has been imported into the template.
